## Introduction:

### **Purpose of Two-Way Radio**

- Communicate during emergency situations
- Alternative to cell phones or land lines
- Respond quicker & reduce response time
- Campus wide alert of threats/hazards
- In addition to the "Text Communication Program"

# Emergency Risks

- Natural Disasters
  - A) Earthquakes
  - B) Flood
- Fire
- Armed Intruder/Hostage Situation
- Bomb Threats
- Chemical or Hazmat Spill
- Missing resident or child

# Roles & Responsibility

- Notify others of on campus emergencies
- Communicate with outside emergency representative (example: fire, ambulance etc.)
- Take action to reduce injuries and potential fatalities
- Assist in evacuations, sound alarms and conduct role call

# Motorola Talkabout Two-Way Radio

Model MR350/351

- Features:
- Range up to 35 miles
- 22-Channels with 121 privacy codes for 2,662 combinations
- 11-Weather channels with alert
- Priority scan
- Mini-USB charging port

# Designated Frequency

- Home Channel (3) 116 (Digital Frequency)
- Two-Way radio must be in scanning mode at all times.
- During an Alert/ None Emergency related communication must cease.

# Protocol for Reporting Emergency

- State your: (twice)
  - \*Name
  - \*Location
  - \*Emergency situation

Note: After a total of 30 seconds feel free to seek clarification via two-way radio.

- When the emergency is clear, a second alert will be given that notifies you that it is ok to return to your work centers.
